#### **Attendance Notices**

Securing great attendance for all our pupils remains a key priority for us as we come towards our final term of the year. Currently, we are in the top 10-20% of schools nationally for great attendance (DfE Attendance Dashboard).

At the end of February, the government announced its intention to increase fines for poor attendance from £60 to £80.

Whilst our primary aim is to work with families to support excellent attendance, we do need families to understand that we have a legal duty to follow Birmingham Council's 'Fast Track' proceedings where families are not actively supporting school's efforts to improve attendance.
